Reading Engagement



Students helped select the books for the new library.

Library lessons highlight technology.

Open book exchanges, less restrictive borrower limits. Students "eat up" books!

More guided lessons and think alouds about reading strategies.

Easy access to Internet through technology has expanded the resources available to students.

Using Voki for reading responses and "battle of the books" wiki is very popular.



Technology for Learning



Technology is used in 95% of the lessons in the library.

Incorporating technology into the curriculum is a large part of my role as a teacher-librarian.

Technology is embedded in every lesson: Animoto, Smartboard, web links, Glogster, Moviemaker, digital photos...

We are very tech focused.

Use of databases and online encyclopedias promoted (to both teachers and students) which has led to far less "Google" type searching.



Discovery & Guided Inquiry



Critical thinking is key. Success criteria and goal setting is important to craft lessons and learning opportunities.

I would like to dig deeper but find it hard to work with teachers on big units.

I try to follow the model with the instructions I give students. However it is always difficult to get teachers to give you the time to teach it properly. I sneak it in any way I can.

Together for Learning has influenced my instructional approach.



Professional Learning Communities




For me this is where I make most of my collaborative connections and get ideas for new learning and uses of technology in the library.

I am a team leader for a TLLP-Critical Thinking with tech tools and facilitate the TLCPs at my school.

I am on Twitter everyday. I am actively pursuing connections with our family of schools and basically participating any in PLC I can at the school.

Local TLs meet as a group about every 6 to 8 weeks to discuss issues and share ideas.


Selecting a topic and deciding on the focus of your research is key. Use the organizers provided to help you develop your topic and sub-topics.







WHAT DOES CITATION MEAN?

When conducting research you collect information, lides and gurrations from many sources. You must acknowledge each source with a citation.

CITING MEANS THAT:

Your sources can be verified for their authority and currency.

Your research steps can be re-craned, so that your audience can consult specific sources and assess your conductions about the book.

You are honest about arknowledging others' words and ideas.

You are able to back upyour own ideas with the ideas of the experts.





Early Learners Love Non-Fiction!

Children are more engaged in reading when they are able to choose books that highlight interests and passions. Many students, particularly boys are enthusiastic about high-interest non-fiction material. Giving students a choice promotes independent reading, fosters a better understanding of the value of reading and empowers and motivates students.



Why Read

Non-fiction?

- "Some students prefer non-fiction and that's ok
- It allows students to access high interest topics (cars, animals, dinosaurs, arts and crafts)
- · It builds background knowledge
- 5 tudents learn to read non-fiction in a variety of ways (diagrams, labels, charts, text boxes)
- Multi-leveled text allows students to access 'chanks' of information at an appropriate reading and interest level
- · It helps to increase and extend vocabulary
- · It enhances understanding of different topics
- It can be a strong motivator because it builds on student interest
- It helps young students to make 'real' world connections

How Can I Support My Students with Non-fiction reading?

- · Value and support student non-friction choices
- Allow frequent opportunities for students to select non-fiction from your school library
- Discuss student interests and help them to find related materials in the library
- : Create apportunities to model how readers access non-fiction
- Ensure that young children are exposed to nonfiction materials in the classroom
- Talk with your students about ideas and information gathered from non-fiction texts
- Be sure to include non-fiction in read aloud experiences
- Provide suggestions for parents on ways that they can support non-fiction reading at home.

Why is Non-Fiction Important?

... Info-Kids - are often actively engaged in learning on a variety of levels. It is their interest in a specific topic that motivates them to want to learn, and in many cases to realize that they need to read better.
